

A global project to establish a recognised Profession for PLM

The Professional PLM Initiative is a collaborative, industry-wide movement that aims to establish a single, internationally-recognised profession for PLM practitioners in all countries and in all types of role.

This will enhance the profile of PLM amongst other business disciplines; define standardised levels of expertise; and provide a worldwide voice for PLM development. It will also raise the overall standard of PLM implementation by creating a neutral model of best practice.

The Steering Group

The Steering Group provides an independent, high-level viewpoint that represents the voice of real PLM user, vendor and advisor companies. It is the role of Steering Group to ensure that the professional structure is comprehensive, fair and accurate, and to set the direction and targets that the Professional PLM Initiative will achieve.

What is the Format?

Steering Group meetings are held on-line once every two months, and usually last half a day. All of the working material is provided in advance by the PLMIG, which also produces the Summary Documentation and carries out the actions. There is no legal or practical obligation or liability arising from Steering Group Membership.

Funding

Participating organisations pay a fee of €3450 / £3000 / \$3850 to fund the Steering Group activity. This covers all of the support work of the PLMIG and all of the meeting participation through to the end of the Foundation Stage.
